The men put up a valiant effort against a fabulous Rio Grande team but went down to a 70-59 defeat.


Girls:

INTERESTED IN COSTUMING?

The Theater Department of Shawnee State Community College tentatively plans to offer a course in costume design this coming Winter term.

Taught by Dr. John Galyean, Ph.D. from Bowling Green State University, the course would involve designing costumes from 5 major dramatic periods: Greek or Roman, Elizabethan, Neoclassical, 19th Century Europe/U.S.A., and Modern. The main purpose of the course is to explore the fundamentals of good costume designs, their function as enhancers of characterization, and the techniques involved in rendering costume designs on paper. Elementary make-up will also be taught.

NOTE: This course does not involve sewing, pattern drafting or fabric construction of any kind! We will be concerned only with design and interpretation of costumes as they contribute to dramatic production.
