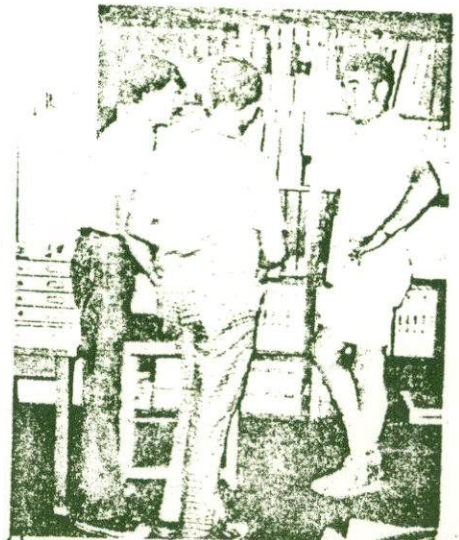

Sometimes

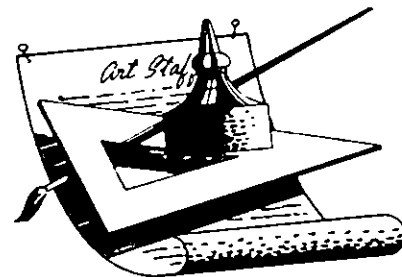
Sometimes I feel crazy,

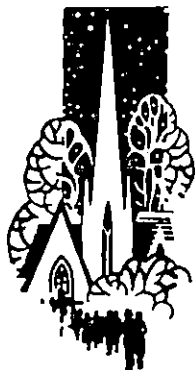
