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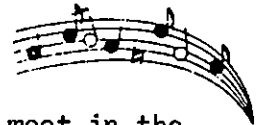

### Ohio Two-Year Colleges Face Financial Crisis

According to Hal Roach, Executive Director of the Ohio Technical and Community College Association, preliminary reports indicate that enrollment on technical and community college campuses will be up between ten (10) and fifteen (15) percent over last year. As a result of this added enrollment, a three (3) percent operating budget cutback was put into effect in July; and a six (6) percent additional cut is expected in January.

### Record Number of Students Attending Ohio's Technical and Community Colleges

Also according to Hal Roach, combined student enrollments on the twenty-four (24) State-assisted and locally autonomous technical and community college campuses should exceed 100,000.

According to data from the Ohio Board of Regents, this will be the eighteenth (18) consecutive year that enrollments have increased in the public two-year college sector.

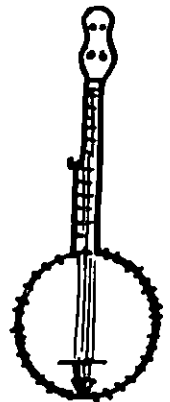
