MINUTES

SHAWNEE STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE Board of Trustees Meeting Monday, October 18, 1982

The meeting was called to order by Chariman Carson.

ROLL CALL

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Hyland moved and Mr. Morgan seconded the motion to approved the minutes of the September 20, 1982 Board of Trustees meeting.

A unanimous voice vote was cast to approve the minutes.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Taylor introduced Steve Burdette, American Sign Company, to answer questions and go over the proposal attached, and made a part of these minutes, concerning the purchase of a sign and message center. Mr. Burdette answered questions by referring to the attached proposal. He discussed the option for purchasing or leasing, costs, benefits and availability of this message center. After Mr. Burdette's presentation the Board members discussed at some length the pros and cons of such a purchase and it was decided to postpone a vote on the purchase until the November Board meeting. Mr. Howard was directed to find the cost per hour for the operation of the message center.

Mr. Taylor continued his report with reference to the development of a Historic District. Before a special meeting with the public and members of the Historic Society, and property owners in the 900 block of Second Street could be held, Mr. Taylor met with the Portsmouth City Council to speak with them concerning the establishment of a Historic District on Second Street. The Portsmouth City Council had no problem with the idea of the establishment of a Historic District, and welcomed a solution to the problem of people who did not want to sell their land to the College.

A meeting has been set for Tuesday October 26, 1982 in Massie Hall auditorium for the public to be advised about the establishing of a Historic District, to be developed by private developers. This development will provide the college with needed housing for students and also protect the college's environment, since some of the property on Second Street is becoming sub-standard. Other assets from this proposal are the freeing up of monies so that property on the South side of Second Street can be purchased, the positive editorial published in the Daily Times, and a letter of approval from the Scioto Historical Society.
