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MINUTES

SHAWNEE STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE Board of Trustees Meeting Monday, July 18, 1983

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Hyland.

ROLL CALL

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Baxter moved and Mr. Rittenour seconded a motion to approve the minutes of the June 20, 1983 meeting.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Taylor began his report by giving the Board members a <u>detter</u> from Dr. Kadel, Director of the Dental Hygiene Program, indicating the performance of the Dental Hygiene students in regional clinical examinations. (Letter attached for information.)

Mr. Taylor also gave Board members for their information a letter from the Gannett Foundation indicating that they are awarding Shawnee State a grant of \$2,000 toward the cost of getting the older homes in the neighborhood nominated to the National Register. Also a grant of \$3,000 has been awarded from the Ohio Historic Society for the same purpose. (Information about both grants is attached to these minutes). This is a matching grant and the work is being completed by Landmarks Rennaisance Corporation for the nomination to the National Register of the neighborhood.

Continuing his report Mr. Taylor indicated that the Home for the Aged at the corner of Second and Bond Streets has been offered to the college for a purchasing price of \$125,000. The college appraiser had appraised the property at \$97,000. The consensus of opinion among the Trustees was that a position of compromise be taken by Mr. Taylor. Mr. Taylor was to discuss this position with the appropriate individuals at the Home for the Aged.

In regard to the topic of student housing, Mr. Taylor indicated that Mr. Riffe had put at the disposal of the college Ms. Jody Piehowicz to work with the Attorney General's office in obtaining an opinion of the legality of the college leasing the houses they own to a developer for student housing. Ms. Piehowicz and Mr. Riffe have indicated they feel the problem of developing student housing can be resolved to the satisfaction of the college. Mr. Levi and Mr. Glockner, Portsmouth developers are interested in developing the ten houses owned by the College should approval be obtained. Mr. Dues has met with Mr. Levi and Mr. Glockner's accountants and attorneys and these people agreed that the project is a good investment. However, they are asking that the college guarantee that 81 students are available as renters. After some discussion the Board members decided that when the decision concerning student housing is resolved that the Board will meet again to discuss the development of this property into student housing, to look at all options, and recommended that the project should be re-bid.

Shawnee State Community College entered into a contract with Endeco Corporation to formulate plans for the development of student housing and the renovation of the property purchased by the college. The sum of \$48,000 was agreed upon. Dr. Carson, Acting Chairman of the Finance Committee, made a motion to pay Endeco \$25,000 at this time. The motion was seconded by Dr. White.
