#### President's Report

Dr. Chapman reported on the Pepsi Can campaign. He stated that SSU's logo and event information would be on the side of Pepsi cans for the next ten years. There are currently 1.4 million SSU/Pepsi cans circulating.

Dr. Chapman reported on the SSU webpage. He stated it would be up and running by April 30, 1999. He said the new page had better eye appeal and would contain our new slogan "You can get there from here."

He further reported on the new governance system. He stated that it was moving along. The tentative name for the new governance body was the University Council. In response to a question from Mr. Waller, the President noted the new governance system should be established before Fall, 1999. He announced Dr. William Parker former Vice President of Minority Affairs at the University of Kentucky, would be the commencement speaker this June. He further spoke on the All-University Service Day. Volunteers will work together to clean up the campus on April 16, 1999. He briefly spoke on the inauguration process, SSU hosting of the Ninth Annual Science Day and on the continuing process of building new residence halls.

# Academic Affairs Committee - Mrs. Patricia Richards, Chairperson

Mrs. Richards started by congratulating the SSU Women's Basketball Team and Coach Robin Hagen-Smith on winning the NAIA National Championship.

Mrs. Richards commended Dr. Mauldin, GEP Coordinator, on the report on the review of the General Education Program. The Academic Affairs committee was impressed by the work of the GEP Committee.

# Quality of University Life - Mr. George Clayton, Chairperson

Mr. Clayton congratulated Coach Robin Hagen-Smith and the Women's Basketball Team not only for their outstanding performance on winning the NAIA Division II National Championship but also on their academic achievements as well.

Mr. Clayton asked Coach Robin Hagen-Smith to speak. She said it was an honor to participate and that it was amazing how many lives the championship touched. She said there were forty-two fans with them at the game. She commended the Board on reactivating scholarships. She stated that scholarships were very important and that they made it easier to be selective. Mr. Waller commented that all the women's basketball team had done a wonderful job. The community enjoyed watching them, and particularly noteworthy is that the team had five Academic All-Americans.

Mr. Clayton moved and Ms. Richards seconded approval of Resolution Q1-99 NAIA Division II Women's Basketball National Champions.

The Board approved by acclamation.

Mr. Clayton reported that the committee received information on the Student Senate, the Student Programming Board and the student loan default rate. He reported that the Student Programming Board is in the process of looking for officers. He also reported that the Student Programming Board had implemented fiscal discipline over last year and that this was the first year they reported being in the black. Mr. Clayton further commented that the unofficial student loan default rate dropped to 9.4% for FY 1997 which compares favorably to the 1996 default rate of 14.6% and the 1995 default rate of 20.2%. He further stated that Pat Moore and the financial aid staff was doing a great job.

### Finance and Facilities - Mr. George Davis III, Vice Chairperson

Mr. Davis commented that Mr. Murphy, Vice President of Business Affairs, provided an excellent report to the committee.

Mr. Davis reported on the additional cost of the Children's Learning Center, personnel items, FY 2000 budget, and the new administrative software review process. He also stated that Aramark indicated their intent to cancel their contract with the University if the thirty-day good faith discussion period did not cure problems with the contract. The University provided its own 90-day notice of termination with Aramark if the 30-day discussion period did not correct the problem. He stated the University had already sent out the Request for Proposals in case the contract was ultimately terminated. He further commented that the PACE report looked good and that the capital status report was attached and self-explanatory.

# Executive Committee - Mr. Waller, Chairperson

Mr. Waller briefed the Board on the Executive Committee actions at their March 18 meeting. He said the committee reinstated athletic scholarships and halted the move toward football; passed a parking policy; and approved two grants.

# **RESOLUTION A3–99**

# APPROVAL OF NEW DEGREE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the University Faculty Assembly approves the following new degree program: Bachelor of Arts in Psychology; and

WHEREAS, the Provost and the President recommend the proposed program to the Academic Affairs Committee of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, the Academic Affairs Committee concurs with the recommendations, and therefore recommends that the proposed degree program be submitted to the Ohio Board of Regents;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Shawnee State University approves these recommendations.

# 3. A. in Psychology Synopsis

This proposal is for a psychology baccalaureate degree. Like most undergraduate psychology degree programs, this program is unspecialized. Therefore, it is suitable both for students who plan to enter graduate school programs and students who wish to immediately enter the Job market. As with most fields, Job opportunities and salary increase proportionately with years of training and advanced degrees.

This degree will require a total of 186 quarter hours, which consists of 48 hours in the general education program (GEP), 24 hours in basic psychology courses, 32 hours in upper-division content courses, 12 hours in upper-division social science courses and 70 hours in general electives. The required 24 hours in basic psychology ensures that all psychology majors take the introductory course, methodology courses and a capstone course. The student may select the 32 content hours from any of the upper-division psychology courses that are offered. Both the natural science and social science sides of psychology will be well represented once two new courses have been added.

We expect to have approximately 70 students switch from the social science major to the psychology major. This estimate is based on the results of student interest surveys that the Social Science Department has conducted over the past several years. Additionally, the psychology major should attract new students to Shawnee State University. The psychology major is a very cost-efficient major to acquire because no new faculty positions need to be added in order to administer the program. Indeed, once all of the current psychology positions are filled with permanent faculty, the Social Science Department will have more faculty in psychology than in any other area.

#### **RESOLUTION F4-99**

### **TUITION FOR SENIOR CITIZENS**

WHEREAS, the Ohio General Assembly has amended Ohio Revised Code Section 3345.27 to authorize the public universities of Ohio to permit low-income citizens sixty years of age and older to attend courses for credit without charge for tuition; and

WHEREAS, the senior citizens of this area have been a source of tremendous support for the University's extracurricular programs; and

WHEREAS, the Provost and the President recommend the Board of Trustees approve free tuition for senior citizens taking courses for credit as provided in the amended statute; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees finds that the inclusion of senior citizens in the classroom provides an added dimension to the educational experience of all students;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees approves citizens meeting the qualifications of Revised Code Section 3345.27, to attend University courses for credit without charge for tuition except to the extent of the part-time instructional grant awarded by the University; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees authorizes the President to implement this resolution by University policies and procedures; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this Resolution is effective fall quarter of Academic Year 1999-2000.
