Chairperson Jack McCoy called the meeting to order at 1:15 p.m. noting the meeting was in compliance with RC § 121.22(F).

Approval of the May 6, 2011 Agenda

Ms. Seif moved and Dr. Ball seconded a motion to approve the May 6, 2011 agenda. Without discussion, the Board unanimously approved said agenda.

Approval of the March 11, 2011 Board Meeting Minutes

Ms. Higgs-Horwell moved and Dr. Roberts seconded a motion to approve the March 11, 2011 Board meeting minutes. Without discussion, the Board unanimously approved said minutes.

Committee Reports

Academic Affairs Committee – Ms. Seif

Ms. Seif reported on behalf of the Academic and Student Affairs Committee and said the Committee had no action items.

Ms. Seif reported on the Academic and Student Affairs informational items.

Ms. Seif said Dr. David Todt, Provost and Vice President Academic Affairs, reported on the full service faculty promotions. Ms. Seif said Dr. Todt stressed that promotions are not handled lightly. She said there are four different levels of review. Ms. Seif said in accordance with the provisions of Article XIII, Promotions of the Collective Bargaining Agreement between Shawnee State University and Shawnee Education Association, the President, after reviewing individual files and recommendations of the Screening Committee, the Faculty Promotion Committees and the Provost, awarded the following promotions:

Ms. Seif said the Board appreciated the continued service and loyalty of our faculty.

Ms. Seif said Dr. Todt reported on the retirement of Ms. Loretta Jenkins, Assistant Professor, Department of Business Administration, Accounting, effective June 1, 2011.

Ms. Seif said Mr. Mark Moore, Registrar, reported on SSU graduation statistics. She reported that the total number of graduates for Spring Commencement were 432. She also reported that there were 19 students earning Masters Degrees.

Ms. Seif said Dr. Todt reported on the 2011 Women's Center James P. Chapman Service Award which was recently presented to Dr. Roberta Milliken, Professor, Department of English and Humanities.

Ms. Seif also said that Dr. Todt reported on the presentation of the Distinguished Teaching Award by the University Faculty Senate, Faculty Affairs and Development Committee, to Dr. Valerie Myers, Associate Professor, Department of Teacher Education. Ms. Seif said Dr. Myers was also honored by the students at a reception.

Ms. Seif said Dr. Timothy Scheurer, Dean, College of Arts and Sciences, reported on the 2011 Celebration of Scholarship. She said the Celebration of Scholarship was started in 2004 and has continually grown. This year, 48 faculty members assisted 217 students who participated in the event this year.

Ms. Seif said Dr. Todt reported on the Educational Policy and Curriculum Committee and University Faculty Senate approval of a proposal for a traditional baccalaureate track to the BSN.

Ms. Seif said Dr. Paul Crabtree, Interim Vice President for Student Affairs, reported on Shawnee State's Chapter of the National Honor Society Phi Eta Sigma's 2011 Installation.

Ms. Seif said Mr. Matt Allard, President of the Student Government Association, reported on the activities of the SGA.

Ms. Seif said Dr. Crabtree reported on the Evening of Honors Program, sponsored by the Student Government Association, held on April 8, 2011. She said 50 awards were given out.

Ms. Seif said Drs. Todt and Crabtree reported on various campus graduation celebrations. Ms. Seif said nine different departments were holding celebrations this year.

Ms. Seif said that for the educational session, Mr. Bob Trusz, Associate Vice President, Enrollment Management, reported on the Recruitment and Admissions cycle.

Finance and Facilities - Dr. Gail Ball

Dr. Ball reported on behalf of the Finance and Facilities Committee and said the Committee had four action items.

Dr. Ball said the Finance and Facilities Committee recommended approval of Resolution F11-11, Continuing University Spending Authority. This resolution allows the University to continue business operations at present budget levels until state funding and other issues are determined and FY12 budgets can be approved by the Board of Trustees. Dr. Ball said a state budget was expected by June 30. Dr. Ball moved and Ms. Seif seconded a motion to approve Resolution F11-11.

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Dr. Ball said the Finance and Facilities Committee recommended approval of Resolution F12-11, Approval of AY11-12 Student Fees. Dr. Ball said student fees would remain the same except for three fees being modified by the Resolution. Dr. Ball complimented the University for insuring that fees collected go to the uses for which they are intended. Dr. Ball moved and Mr. Mooney seconded a motion to approve Resolution F12-11.

Dr. Ball said the Finance and Facilities Committee recommended approval of Resolution F13-11, Approval of Housing and Meal Plan Rates. Dr. Ball said that housing rates would increase by 3% and meals would increase by 4% which reflects what Sodexo is charging and the University is merely passing on this increase. Dr. Ball moved and Ms. Seif seconded a motion to approve Resolution F13-11. Ayes: Dr. Ball, Ms. Higgs-Horwell, Mr. McCoy, Mr. Mooney, Ms. Seif, Dr. Roberts

Dr. Ball said the Finance and Facilities Committee recommended approval of Resolution F14-11, Appointment of Vice President for Student Affairs. Dr. Ball said Dr. Mary Oling-Sisay's appointment would begin July 1, 2011 replacing Dr. Paul Crabtree who has been serving in this position on an interim basis. Dr. Ball said she would like to thank Dr. Crabtree for his services and said that he was well liked and respected by the University and would be missed. Dr. Ball moved and Ms. Seif seconded a motion to approve Resolution F14-11.

Dr. Ball reported on the Finance and Facilities Committee informational items.

Dr. Ball said Dr. Morris and Dr. Boyles discussed the state budget with the Committee. The budget is expected by June 30.

Dr. Ball said in accordance with Policy 5.16Rev., the personnel appointments for the period February 25, 2011 to April 21, 2011 were reported in the attached consolidated report.

Dr. Ball said that the fiscal year-to-date general operating Pace report was reviewed. She said revenues were up 9.2% largely due to tuition and increases in enrollment.

Dr. Ball said the capital status report reflected current information on major capital projects.

Dr. Ball reported the University's investment activity performance reports were reviewed. She said that investments were up nearly \$2 million for the year.

For the Education Session, Dr. Ball reported that a review of the Employee Assistance Program benefit was presented by Mr. Chris Nourse, Assistant Director of Human Resources.

President's Report

Dr. Morris summarized the written report that she submitted to the Board and is to be made a part of these minutes. She said the Shawnee State's academic reputation has increased in the last several years and her report puts into the record accomplishments that reflect this reputation.

Dr. Morris asked each member to fill out the paper that she passed out to indicate on what committees they would like to serve. She reported on the 25th Anniversary Birthday Bash that was recently held on campus and said it was a huge success. Dr. Morris then reported on the President's Gala. She said 225 guests attended this year's Gala and raised \$31,000 which will be used to restore the Smokestack. She also said she was surprised by friends and colleagues who

honored her with a scholarship in her name in the amount of \$5,200. Dr. Morris thanked Ms. Seif for serving on the Search Committee for the Vice President of Student Affairs. Ms. Seif said the professionalism of the staff who served on the Committee were commendable and said Dr. Todt did a tremendous job leading the search. Dr. Morris said she would like to publicly thank Dr. Crabtree for the wonderful job he has done as interim Vice President.

McCoy with an engraved chair as a token of appreciation for his service to the Shawnee State University Board of Trustees. She said she would miss his leadership and friendship and that SSU was privileged to have had him as a member of the Board.

Mr. McCoy said it had been an honor and privilege to serve as a Board member with his fellow trustees and President Morris. He said he thanked God for the opportunities afforded to him as an American. He said when he first became a member of the Board, the University was in the process of selecting a new President and that he got on the bus at the same time as President Morris and with her driving, that good things have happened at the University. Mr. McCoy thanked his fellow Board members for their friendship and service. A round of applause followed.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the SSU Board of Trustees approves continuing University Spending Authority consistent with the level of resources as approved for fiscal year 2011 until such time that state funding levels of support have been determined and FY12 general fund and auxiliary budgets have been approved.
