He has been a professor for over 10 years, and before that was the Technology Director for Chillicothe City School District for 13 years. He is the cofounder of SOMACC (Southern Ohio Makers Against COVID Coalition). This grassroots group built 4,500 3D printed face shields for first responders at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. One of his most significant accomplishments is building R2-D2, a droid that took him 2.5 years to complete.
